The TOEIC program offers a series of assessments to measure all four English-language communication skills — listening, reading, speaking and writing. The tests measure a range of skill levels, from basic-to-intermediate and advanced level.

- **The TOEIC tests** measure beginner to advanced proficiency levels
- **The TOEIC Bridge® tests** measure beginner to intermediate proficiency levels

The TOEIC program also offers resources for teachers and trainers, as well as preparation materials to ensure test takers are ready to perform to their full potential.

TOEIC tests

Test format and content

TOEIC Listening and Reading scores provide meaningful feedback on a test taker's ability to understand English explanations and instructions, follow public talks and announcements, understand workplace conversations and connect information in different real-world texts.

TOEIC Speaking and Writing scores provide meaningful feedback on a test taker's ability to speak in English that's understood by native and proficient non-native speakers, participate in workplace conversations, write emails and express opinions.



LISTENING

Test takers listen to a variety of recorded questions and conversations in English then answer 100 multiple-choice questions

- Part 1:** Photographs
- Part 2:** Question-Response
- Part 3:** Conversations
- Part 4:** Talks

Total time: 45 minutes



READING

Test takers answer 100 multiple-choice questions based on a variety of written materials

- Part 1:** Incomplete Sentences
- Part 2:** Text Completion
- Part 3:** Reading Comprehension

Total time: 75 minutes



SPEAKING

Test takers record responses to prompts

- Questions 1-2:** Read a Text Aloud
- Questions 3-4:** Describe a Picture
- Questions 5-7:** Respond to Questions
- Questions 8-10:** Respond to Questions Using Information Provided
- Question 11:** Express an Opinion

Total time: Approximately 20 minutes



WRITING

Test takers type responses to prompts

- Questions 1-5:** Write a Sentence Based on a Picture
- Questions 6-7:** Respond to a Written Request
- Question 8:** Write an Opinion Essay

Total time: Approximately 60 minutes

When taken together, the TOEIC Listening, Reading, Speaking and Writing tests provide an accurate, standardized measure of proficiency in all four English-language communication skills.

TOEIC Bridge tests

Test format and content

The TOEIC Bridge tests measure all four English-communication skills and provide meaningful feedback on the English-language proficiency of beginner to intermediate test takers.

This includes the ability to comprehend basic spoken exchanges of information, understand simple written texts, carry out spoken communication tasks in familiar workplace and everyday life contexts, and write simple texts, notes and messages. Individual skills can be combined into complementary test modules offering flexibility, efficiency and convenience.



LISTENING

Test takers answer 50 multiple-choice questions grouped into 4 parts according to question type:

- Part 1: Four Pictures
- Part 2: Question-Response
- Part 3: Conversations
- Part 4: Talks

Total time: Approximately 25 minutes



READING

Test takers answer 50 multiple-choice questions grouped into 3 parts according to question type:

- Part 1: Sentence Completion
- Part 2: Text Completion
- Part 3: Reading Comprehension

Total time: 35 minutes



SPEAKING

Test takers respond to 8 prompts grouped into 6 task types:

- Task 1: Read a Short Text Aloud
- Task 2: Describe a Photograph
- Task 3: Listen and Retell
- Task 4: Short Interaction
- Task 5: Tell a Story
- Task 6: Make and Support a Recommendation

Total time: Approximately 15 minutes



WRITING

Test takers respond to 9 prompts grouped into 5 task types:

- Task 1: Build a Sentence
- Task 2: Write a Sentence
- Task 3: Respond to a Brief Message
- Task 4: Write a Narrative
- Task 5: Respond to an Extended Message

Total time: Approximately 37 minutes
